Our path to Western Springs College 2014.

- Seddon Memorial Technical College moved to 100 Motions Road in 1964. The school moved from its three story Wellesley Street site due to an increasing role and the inclusion of non-technical subjects. The Wellesley Street School became Auckland University of Technology (AUT).
- Although classes began in 1964, lots of site work and building still needed to be completed.
- In 1966 the Gym was opened.
- In 1968 the school was renamed Seddon High School.
- In 1970 the Library was opened.
- In 1991 it was renamed as Western Springs College.
- In 2015/2016 Western Springs College is going to be rebuilt. We will have state of the art facilities to enhance the excellent level of education already provided at WSC.

2013 NCEA results (NZQA Provisional)

Once again, Western Springs College students and staff can be very proud of the NCEA results achieved, with best ever Level 3 & U.E. Pass Rates and best ever Level 1 & 2 Excellence Certificate achieved by Springs students.

Certificate Pass Rates

- ❖ The University Entrance pass rate of 96% is the highest ever attained by WSC students.
- ❖ The Level 3 Certificate pass rate of 97% is the highest ever attained by WSC students.
- ❖ The Level 2 Certificate pass rate of 94% is the second highest at WSC since inception in 2004.
- ❖ The Level 1 Certificate pass rate of 86%.

Excellence Certification

The Level 1 and Level 2 Excellence Endorsement rates indicate that more than one in four Year 11 and Year 12 students were awarded an Excellence Certificate.

- ❖ A Level 1 Excellence Certificate was achieved by 27% (76/281) of Year 11 students – the highest percentage ever attained by WSC students.
- ❖ A Level 2 Excellence Certificate was achieved by 27% (67/248) of Year 12 students - the highest percentage ever attained by WSC students.
- ❖ A Level 3 Excellence Certificate was achieved by 13% (28/219) of Year 13 students – again a rate which has not previously been bettered.

These Excellence-level results represent very pleasing progress in terms of our school learning targets of increasingly high grade quality across all levels.

WSC student Daisy Cleverley is hopeful she will represent NZ in the Women's U20s FIFA World Cup.

Year 12 student Daisy has continued to achieve great things in her stellar football career.

Despite the challenge of coming back from a knee injury where Daisy was unable to play for three months, Daisy has been selected to represent NZ in the women's U17 FIFA World Cup and has also been selected for the wider squad of the NZ U20 women's team.

The U17 World Cup kicked off in Costa Rica with New Zealand playing their first game against Paraguay. Daisy scored an amazing goal, which she ran in from the half way mark. NZ drew 1 all with Paraguay.

The NZ U20s women's team have also qualified for the world cup with convincing wins against Vanuatu, Tonga and Papua New Guinea. The under U20s FIFA World Cup is being held in Canada in August - Daisy has been selected for the wider squad with the final squad of 21 being selected closer to the time.

Daisy says "it is going to be a very exciting year, but also a hectic one with a lot of juggling between training, playing and studying every day of the week. Both my parents and my school have been very supportive which has enabled me to keep everything going".

We have our fingers crossed for Daisy and wish her the very best of luck!
